NAWDP Certification

NAWDP developed the Certified Workforce Development Professional (CWDP) credential using research based on the job requirements of a wide range of workforce development roles. The 5 Competencies the CWDP is based on are:

- Customer Service Methodology
- Diversity in Workforce Development
- Labor Market Information and Intelligence
- Principles of Communication
- Workforce Development Structure, Policies, and Programs

Illinois has 36 CWDPs (renewed every 3 years)

Registered Apprenticeship

The National Guidelines for Apprenticeship Standards for NAWDP were approved June 17. The standards are a model for developing local apprenticeship programs registered with Office of Apprenticeship or a State Apprenticeship Agency for the occupation Workforce Development Professional.

- Approved trainers are listed on the NAWDP website under the Vendor Marketplace. Trainers have been verified by NAWDP as having met the National Guidelines for Apprenticeship Standards.
- Training providers are required to provide a minimum of 150 training hours in nine competencies.
- Training providers have the option of including training in four endorsements.



Registered Apprenticeship

A minimum of 150 training hours in nine competencies is required:

1. Workforce Development Structure, Policies, and Programs
2. Customer Services Methodology
3. Principles of Communication
4. Collaboration and Problem Solving
5. Diversity in Workforce Development
6. Labor Market Information (LMI) and Intelligence
7. Business and Economic Development Intelligence
8. Career Development Principles
9. Program Implementation Principles and Strategies

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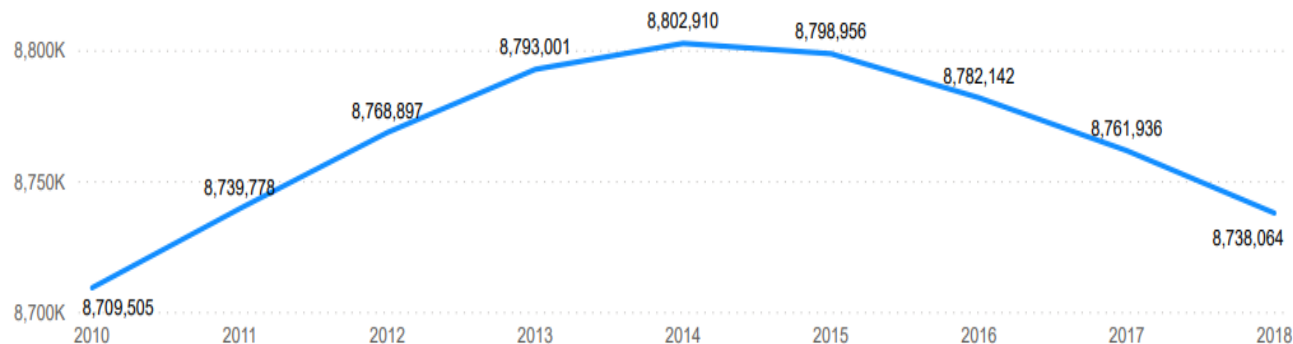

Funding Opportunities

- [Illinois State Apprenticeship Tax Credit Program](#) offers \$3,500 to Illinois Businesses per apprentice plus an additional \$1,500 if the Business is in an underserved area or an apprentice come from an underserved area.
- Local *Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)* Grant Funding (dependent on local funding source)
 - *On-the-Job Training (OJT)* provides partial wage-reimbursement for newly hired employees/apprentices.
 - *Incumbent Worker Training (IWT)* provides funding to assist with job-specific training for existing workers.
 - *Individual Training Account* scholarships awarded to eligible candidates for occupational skills training.
- Apprenticeship Intermediaries
 - Some Apprenticeship Intermediaries have funds allocated to support training in some sectors
 - Apprenticeship [Navigators](#) and [Intermediaries](#) can provide information

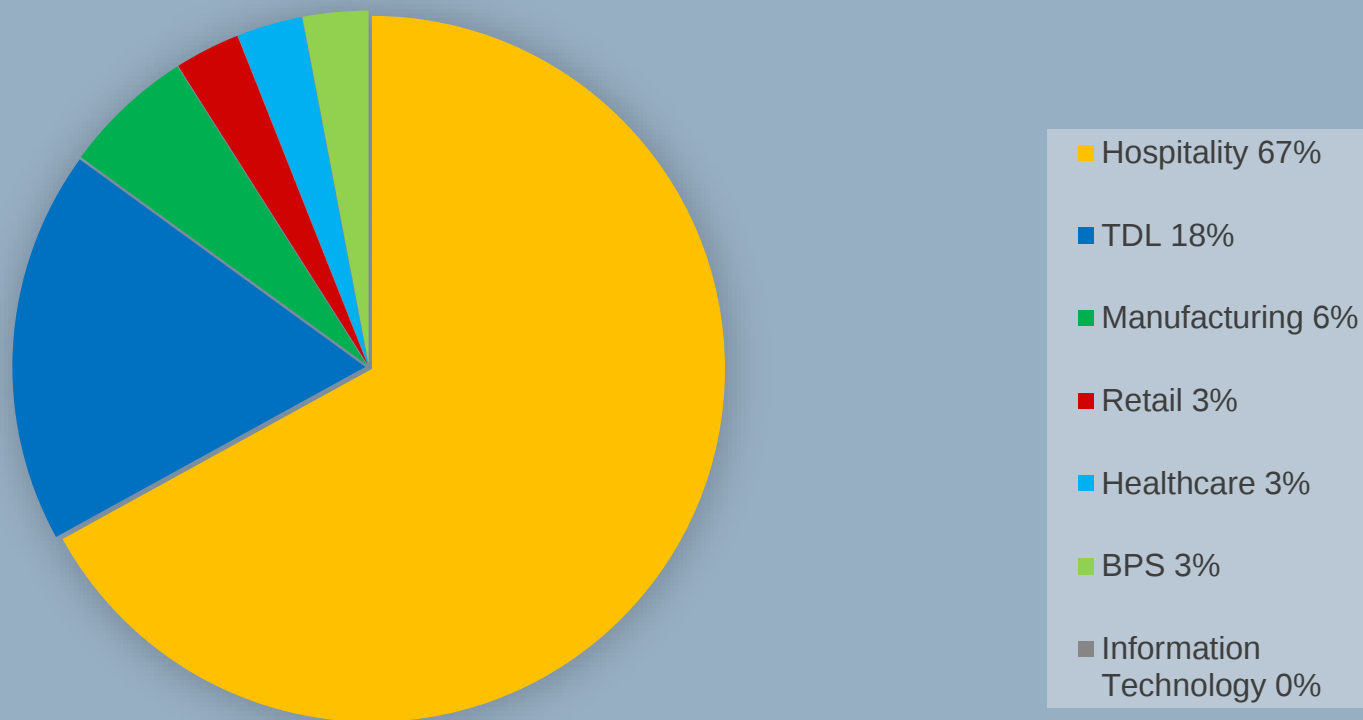

Layoff /WARN events by Industry Sector



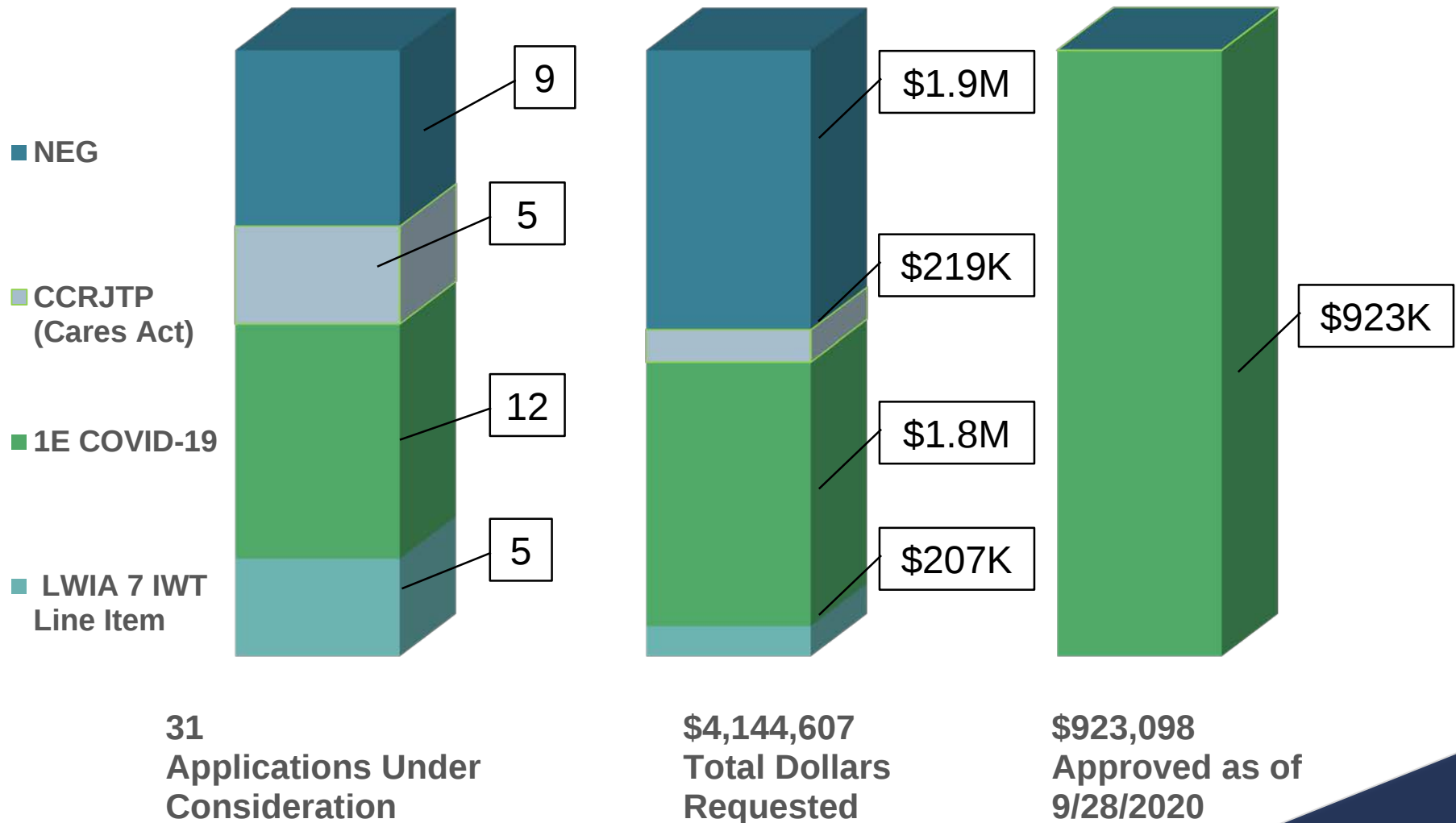

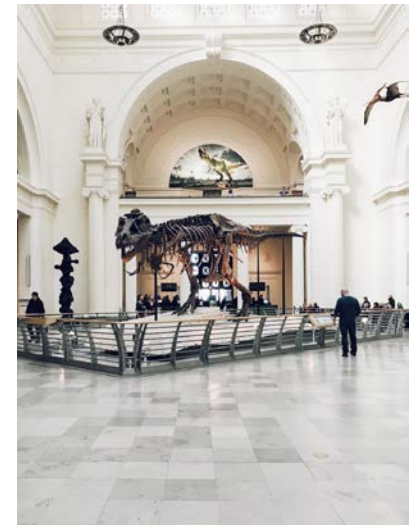

How businesses must adapt now that they are open again:

Phase IV Guidelines include:

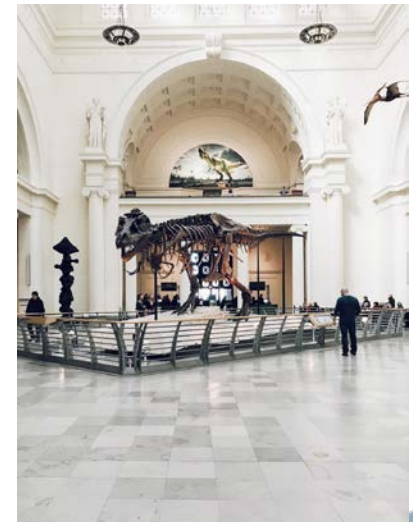
- Indoor gatherings are limited to 50 people or less. Outdoor gatherings are limited to 100 people or less.
- Indoor dining is allowed at 25% capacity. Outdoor dining, carryout, and delivery are allowed.
- Movie theaters and performing arts venues are limited to 50 guests or 50% capacity.
- Museums and zoos are limited to 25% capacity with tours limited to 50 people or less.
- Social distancing and face coverings are required whenever possible.
- Advanced ticketing/reservations are encouraged whenever possible.



Industry Overview – COVID Adaptations and Future Expectations

How the Sector is Adapting and Assisting our Partners (YOU):

- Business and Jobseeker services, including workshops, pre-screenings and hiring events, are now virtual.
- Slowly transitioning to in-person industry credentialing workshops with limited students per class and safety precautions in place. (A pre-start of class virtual orientation will be mandatory.)
- Shifting the conversation with employer partners from job orders to WBL opportunities / incentives to assist in the maintenance of their current workforce.
- Continually researching and obtaining information from industry experts and employer partners on the state of the industry and how it is adjusting services including areas where new skills are needed.

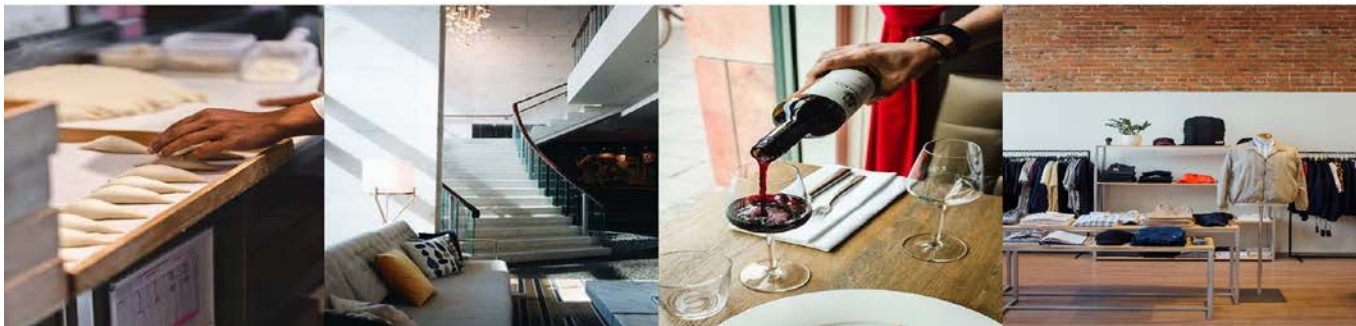

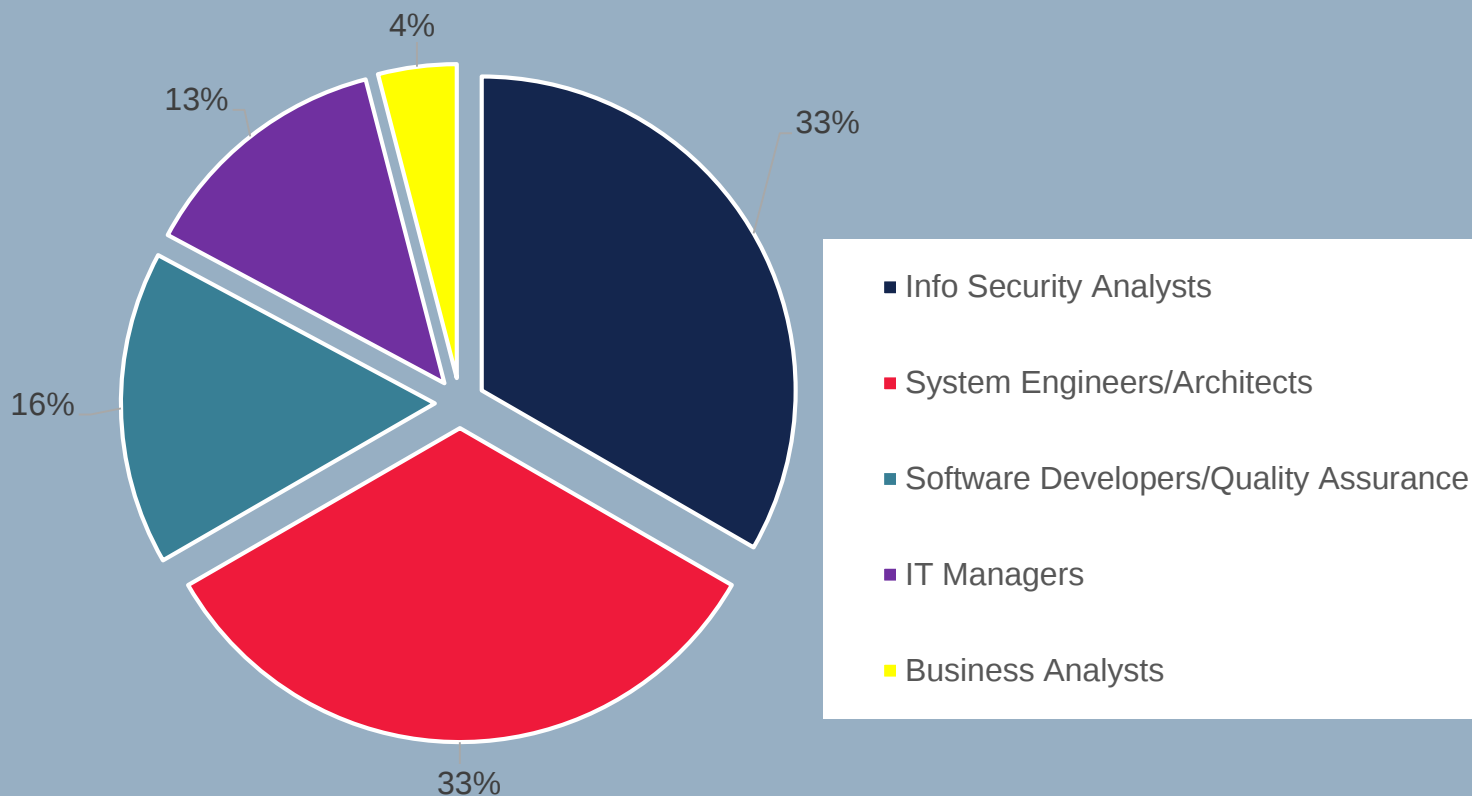

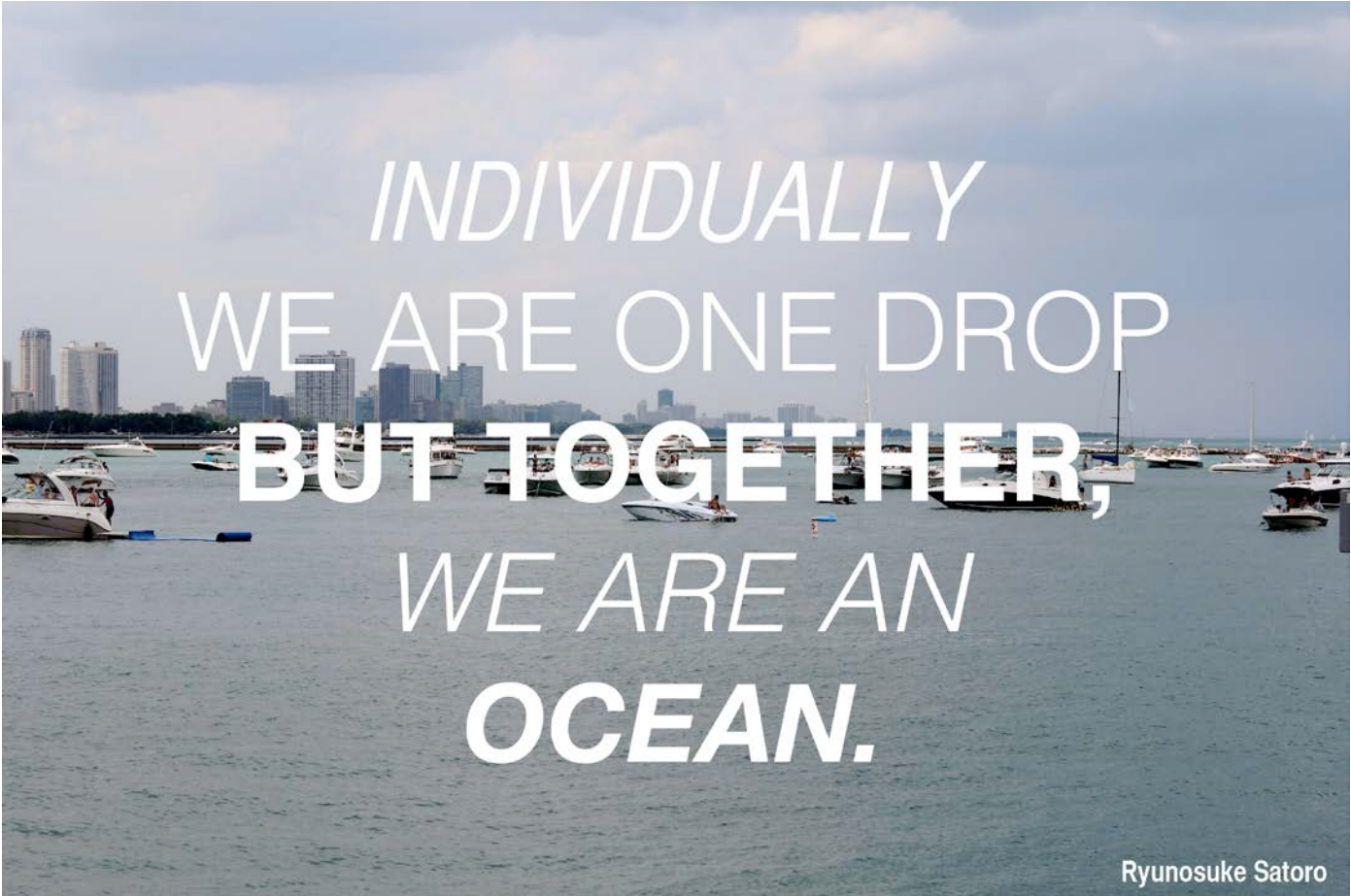
