What? All ONET (occupation) codes are being converted from the 2010 to the 2019 classification in both Career Connect & IWDS.

Why? DOL will soon require 2019 ONET codes on the WIOA federal reports.

When? Fri. 2/18 thru Tues. 2/22/2022

➤ Program Data:

- WIOA Application > Employment Tab*
- Low-growth Occupations* (back-end table for determining Dislocated Worker eligibility; same updates being made in IWDS)
- Training and Work-based Learning service activities
- WIOA eligible ITA & Registered Apprenticeship training programs*
- Employment:
 - Employment bar
 - Employment at closure/exit
 - Supplemental employment in Q1-Q4 of follow-up*

➤ Reports

*WIOA program data only.

- Since all historic & current data is being converted in both systems, impact should be minimal.
- 2019 ONETs are already being used in many external labor market information sites.
- The next few slides explain some things to look for and provide links to resources.

- *ONET Crosswalks* Excel file includes:
- *2010 to 2019 Crosswalk* tab: is the full list of 2010 ONETs cross-walked to the 2019 codes
 - *One to Many* tab: lists 2010 ONETs that were split into multiple 2019 ONETs
 - *Added to Taxonomy*: new ONETs added in 2019 version
 - *Code Changes*: Codes that changed from 2010 to 2019
 - *Title Changes*: Codes that stayed the same but have update titles

One-to-Many

When an ONET split from one to multiple and there was an “All Other” category, ONET was generally converted to the “All Other” category.

In this example, 11-9199.99 converted to 11-9199.00.

One-to-Many

When an ONET split from one to multiple and there was no “All Other” category, ONET was generally converted to top ONET code (lowest number).

In this example, 15-1132.00-Software Developers, Applications would be converted to 15-1252.00-Software Developers.

Business Service Reps may want to run a job order report and review the ONETs for active jobs where the ONET split from one to multiple.

- Go to Reports > Detailed Reports > Job Order and click the *List* link (it's the last option).
- Select the following filters to return all active job orders for your office:
 - *Office*: select your office(s)
 - *Filter by Date*: Active Date
 - *Date Range*: Today
- The report will include the job order ONET codes. You can export into Excel and sort or filter by ONET code or title.
- BSRs can edit job order ONET codes as needed.
